

The programme began with the unfurling of the National Flag by the Registrar, followed by the National Anthem and distribution of sweets among participants. 
Expert Talk on Traffic Rules and Signals



Cleanliness Drive


Dandiya Noon




IBM Skillbuild Workshop (Cloud & AI)


Alumni Talk


